


CBAS Assessment Process

Domains of the CBAS Assessment

- **Nursing-** Medical History and Physical Assessment, medication reconciliation, dietary needs
- **PT/OT-** ADL's functional ability, strength, tone, coordination, range of motion, functional mobility, fall risk (Get up and Go, Tinetti) fall risk factors, functional cognition, safety, judgment, DME.
- **ST-** *as needed* - speech and language, cognitive, dysphagia

Domains of the CBAS Assessment, continued...

- **SW-** IADL's, personal and family history, formal and informal supports, financial status, psychosocial risk factors legal status (DPHAC), social history, language abilities, cognitive status and screening, behavioral status, mental health status, depression screening, caregiver assessment (CSI), transportation plan
- **Activities-** Person-centered care assessment to establish therapeutic activities
- **Dietary-** *as needed*
- **Psychiatric/Psychological-** *as needed*

- TOPS is an outcome measurement system developed under a grant from the California Community Foundation in 2009-2010 and piloted among 8 Los Angeles County adult day programs and Adult Day Health Centers.
- It has been recently adapted as the basis for measuring outcomes in the Community-Based Health Home Project at 7 CBAS sites.
- The web-based tool is undergoing programming changes and will re-launch in 2014 (paper-based data collection in the interim).

Coordination of Care in LTSS: A CBAS Perspective

- Strengths- IDT, caregiver assessment, built-in care coordination framework, focus on strengths and maintaining function
- Weaknesses- strong reliance on individual clinical judgement, no one entity accountable for care coordination and outcomes, sharing common data and vocabulary, integration of PCP into care coordination
- Opportunities- health home, managing the constellation of care, truly operationalizing PCC
