Updates	 Interim licensing standards (ILS) for Foster Family Agencies (FFA) are out for stakeholder review with Short-term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) ILS to follow. All County Letter (ACL) regarding AB 403 Group Home Extension Request to Continue Placements and Current Rate Classification (RCL) was released August 19, 2016. CDSS is currently working to update the Statewide Automated Welfare System (SAWS) to implement the new Child Welfare Services (CWS) rates. The CCR Regional Ideas & Transformation Exchange (RITE) Convenings have been scheduled as follows: CCR RITE Bay Area, on August 19, 2016. CCR RITE Los Angeles on August 31, 2016. CCR RITE Central, on September 23, 2016. CCR RITE Southern, on October 11, 2016. Representatives from local CWS, CBHDA, CPOC, DHCS, and California Department of Education (CDE) are invited to attend the RITEs. CPOC recommended that the Judicial

	CDSS will be providing regional meetings for FFA and Group Home to specifically address questions in conjunction with the release of the Interim Licensing Standards (ILS).
III.	The ACL regarding Child and Family Team (CFT) has been released for stakeholder review focusing on feedback from Probation particularly youth who are eligible for IV-E and have placement orders.
Integration of Education in CCR Implementation Sara Rogers	Discussion regarding the fundamental role and services of education particularly how the Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) system interplays with CWS and the Mental Health systems and the incorporation into CCR. It is important to identify the needs that foster youth have specific to education and the funding sources for services. The following are issues to be addressed: • Funding for the education of youth in out of home placement (GH) sun-setting of the RCL rates on January 1, 2017.
	 Authority to disburse funding and whether it will be in budget trailer language or if statutory change should be determined.
	 The Transition Year: SELPA will need to figure out how to use funds.
	 Determine an alternative methodology and account for the transition period.
	 Ensure that the regulatory change in California does not undermine federal
	requirements.
	Funding should be identified early for children in RCL level settings. There are funding sources in AB 8602 to acknowledge foster youth placed in residential settings. It was suggested that DHCS, CBHDA, CWDA, and CDSS discuss this and how to integrate the education piece in planning. Other things to consider are where the youth are located geographically, how that relates to stability and how the funding is delivered to reflect the distribution statewide.

	There was also discussion regarding who from education should attend the CFT and the issues related to participation barriers: scheduling challenges, geographic issues, and conflict of interest. There was a question regarding the role and requirements of the CDE in the CFT. CDE would like assurance that the discussion at the CFT would not impact the Individualized Educational Program (IEP) (providing a distinction between the CFT and the IEP). However, the CFT might be helpful to inform the IEP.

	Include education partners in feedback for ACL regarding CFT.
	 Add education to Implementation Guide. Participate in SELPA workgroup.

Program/Medi-Cal	DHCS is combining the Mental Health Approval Process and the Medi-Cal Certification Process. The
Certification	protocol is scheduled to be released early September for stakeholder feedback.
Karen Baylor	Medi-Cal certification will continue to be approved triennially.
	A question was asked about the appeal process if a provider appeals the county's decision regarding program approval or certification. DHCS will review its current appeals process to determine if it applies to appeals regarding program approval. DHCS confirmed that if the county terminates a contract with a provider, there must be a written notice sent to the beneficiary to transition care.
