August released planned. ACL draft document in the form of a Q&A about accreditation and rates to be released in August. There will be a subsequent meeting to review the 5 domains that have been identified; date of next meeting is August 26th. 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John Sanfilippo	D. Review Process for requesting an extension for GH	
	 Counties must request an extension on behalf of GH providers. Extension allows for: A GH to continue receiving their existing GH RCL rate. GH time to meet requirements for accreditation and/or MH certification. Extension request also sent to and reviewed by the Foster Care Rates Bureau in CDSS. GH's need to apply to become a STRTP with Community Care Licensing (CCL). Effective 1/1/17, no new RCL rates will be issued. Extension requests only for GHs, not needed for FFAs. If the GH is not ready to convert to a STRTP, in order to continue receiving their RCL rate they must request extension through the county welfare or probation department. Extensions may be granted for 6-12 months on a condition that the GH is working on becoming a STRTP or the county has yet to develop the capacity needed to step youth down to a Home Based Foster Care (HBFC) setting. If GH is converting to a STRTP, more time may be needed due to: Lack of resource families willing to have youth placed with them. Insufficient home based services to transition youth. Material risk to children. Partnering is needed with County MH, Probation, and Child Welfare Services (CWS) where MH is provided. In attempting to step youth down from GH to HBFC settings, counties should determine the placement/capacity needs with GH providers that provide specialty MH services and include the local MH dept.

Review requirement for county review of Program Statement & Letter of Recommendation GHs looking to become STRTP need and new FFA applicants: Develop a new program statement Outreach to host county where facility is located and other counties that may place in the facility. Letter of recommendation from a county placing agency with statement that the agency reviewed the program statement. Provide statement to CCL that you reached out to the host county for review if the letter of recommendation is not from the host county and the facility notified the host county that another county provided a letter of recommendation. A new letter of recommendation not required if the facility moves locations.

	Review the program statement.	
	Decline to review and decline to provide recommendation.	
	Provide letter of recommendation.	
	Currently licensed FFAs should submit a copy of the updated program statement to all county placing agencies	
	with which placements are coordinated or for which services are provided.
