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# California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Housing Support Program (HSP)

The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) is excited to announce a new housing program that will be offered to homeless families in the CalWORKs program.

## Program Background

- Senate Bill (SB) 855 allocated \$20 million for a new Housing Support Program (HSP) for eligible CalWORKs recipients
- Twenty counties were awarded HSP funds in September 2014, which must be used before June 30, 2015
- Counties were given the flexibility to design their own county specific HSP plan to serve the needs of their community.

## **Program Goals and Target Population**

- Assist homeless families in quickly obtaining permanent housing and provide wrap-around supports to families to foster housing retention.
- Core components include comprehensive and coordinated entry with community partners along a continuum of care, housing identification, rent and moving assistance, focused case management, and services based on individual participant needs.

#### **Program Requirements**

- Counties are required to use evidenced-based models, including those established in the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development's Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP).
- Rapid Re-Housing and targeted homelessness prevention programs have been implemented nationwide as cost effective strategies to help families exit or avoid homelessness and retain permanent housing.

#### **Program Duration and Services Provided**

- Housing subsidies may range from a few months to several months, depending on the individual needs of the family.
- Individual county program plans differ in terms of eligibility requirements, services offered, or duration of a family's eligibility.
- HSP services offered may include, but are not limited to, any of the following:
  - Financial assistance, including rental assistance, security deposits, utility payments, moving costs and motel and hotel vouchers; and
  - Housing stabilization and relocation, including outreach and engagement, landlord recruitment, case management, housing outreach and placement, legal services, and credit repair.
