Reporting to Law Enforcement		Caseworkers must report immediately (no later than 24 hrs.) to law enforcement all dependents that they identify as CSEC. Caseworkers shall report immediately, or in no case later than 24 hours, info on missing/abducted dependent children and youth are CSE/at-risk to law enforcement so they can be entered into NCIC and National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
