The purpose of this letter is to release the CBCAP application and allocations for SFY 2013-14. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) utilizes this annual CBCAP application and allocation process for county administered child welfare agencies in order to support local prevention and early intervention efforts statewide. This annual application and allocation process requires county submission of the CBCAP Application and Assurances Form and Certification of County Children's Trust Fund (CCTF) Revenue Form.

The CBCAP Application and Assurances Form (Attachment A) serves as the county's formal application for the CBCAP funds and assures the Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP) that these funds will be expended during the SFY in a manner that complies with all state and federal requirements.

This form requires the signature of an authorized representative of the County Board of Supervisors (BOS) designated public agency to administer the CBCAP Program. This designated agency is responsible for the administration of the CBCAP program, fiscal oversight, adherence to the CBCAP assurances and annual report submittal to the OCAP. The **Certification of CCTF Revenue Form** (Attachment B) must also be completed and signed by an authorized representative of the BOS designated public agency to administer the CBCAP Program.

 This form captures the CCTF annual revenue and expenditure amounts includ total birth certificate fees received by a county in accordance with the Welfa and Institutions Code Section 18966

The **CBCAP Allocation** (Attachment C) for SFY 2013-14 is based in part by the total annual birth certificate fees received by each county and reported to the OCAP on the Certification of CCTF Revenue Form for SFY 2011-12. The **CBCAP Allocation Methodology** (Attachment D) is used to calculate the allocation. As the result of a calculation error, last year, counties were slightly overpaid last year. That error has been corrected in this year's allocations, and will be reflected by amounts slightly less than last year.

The CBCAP allocation for SFY 2013-14 will be released upon submission, review and approval of the CBCAP Application and Assurances Form (Attachment A), Certification of CCTF Revenue Form (Attachment B) and the OCAP Annual Report. The CBCAP Application and Assurances and Certification of CCTF Revenue forms are attached to this ACIN or may be downloaded from http://www.cdsscounties.ca.gov/. Both forms must contain **original signatures in blue ink, are due by December 10, 2013** and should be mailed to:

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Allocation Methodology for Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) Funds For State Fiscal Year 2013-14

BASE ALLOCATION

In accordance with the Welfare and Institutions Code (W&IC) Section 18966.1(a), the CBCAP allocation is calculated annually as follows:

- (1) Counties that receive less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) per year in birth certificate fees for their County Children's Trust Funds (CCTF) shall be granted the amount of CBCAP funds necessary to bring total birth certificate fees to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) per year.
- (2) The remaining CBCAP funds shall then be distributed equally among all the counties, up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per county.
- (3) If sufficient CBCAP funds exist after (1) and (2) have been implemented, the remaining CBCAP funds shall be distributed to each county according to population.
- (4) The CBCAP funds deposited into the CCTF must adhere to the CBCAP and the CCTF requirements as applicable.
