**INFORMATION NOTICE (ACIN) I-46-12** 

This letter is to transmit the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2013 IRT chart for the CalWORKs Program. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) developed the attached IRT chart to provide the County Welfare Departments (CWDs) with the IRT amounts to be used to meet the recipient income reporting requirements in the MPP Sections 44-316.321(e) and 44-316.324. These IRT levels became effective October 1, 2012 for all Assistance Units (AUs) with the exception of AUs assigned to the Annual Reporting/Child-Only (AR/CO) system implemented by ACL 12-49. The AR/CO IRT will be re-released in the near future via ACL 12-49E with corrected IRT figures.

#### **IRT Reporting Requirements**

Under the QR/PB reporting system, CalWORKs recipients are required to report only certain changes in their income or family circumstances mid-quarter. One such mandatory mid-quarter report is when the AU's total income exceeds the IRT. The IRT is the greater of 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) for the number of persons whose needs are included in the determination of the cash aid amount, <u>or</u> the level at which an AU becomes financially ineligible. Income that must be reported for IRT purposes includes income that is required to be reported

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for penalized, excluded, and timed-out individuals and the income of persons not in the AU who were included in the determination of income eligibility and grant amounts.

Note: AUs with either no income or with unearned income only are required to report if they receive new earned income that, when combined with other household income, exceed the IRT mid-quarter. Therefore, AUs with unearned income only are not required to report when that income by itself exceeds the IRT mid-quarter.

If any member of the AU or person included in the Family Maximum Aid Payment (MAP) has earned income or begins receiving earned income, the AU must report to the CWD when the family has combined gross income, earned and unearned, that exceeds the AU's IRT during the QR payment quarter. Once the family receives income in excess of the IRT and reports it to the CWD, the CWD must take action, per MPP Section 44-316.324(QR)(c)(1), and determine if the reported income is reasonably anticipated to continue and if so, whether the AU's net nonexempt monthly averaged income for the remainder of the current QR Payment Quarter will exceed the AU's MAP. If the averaged income is reasonably anticipated to continue to exceed the AU's MAP for the remainder of the QR Payment Quarter, the CWD shall determine the AU financially ineligible and shall discontinue the AU at the end of the month in which the AU first received the income that exceeded the AU's MAP, with timely and adequate notice to the AU.

#### **Informing Recipients of Their IRT**

The informing notice that provides the IRT limits must be individualized for each CalWORKs case. The CWD shall inform each household of their IRT at the following times: 1) at least once per quarter; 2) at redetermination/recertification; 3) anytime there are changes in the CalWORKs AU or Family MAP size; 4) when there is a change of persons who are required to report income; and 5) upon recipient request. Additionally, the AU must be informed of the new IRT levels any time the IRT chart is updated. The CWDs should also remind recipients that in addition to the IRT requirement, they must report all income and property on their QR 7 and provide relevant verification.

Due to differences in automation and other practices, CWDs may inform recipients of the IRT requirements on the QR 7, the Notice of Action used to add or remove AU members, or on a separate informing notice. The CWD shall follow notification rules regarding individualized IRT levels in accordance with MPP Section(s) 40-173.8 and 44-316.324 as instructed above. The IRT level about which the recipient was last notified will be used for reporting purposes until the CWD has had an opportunity to update the recipient of any applicable IRT change.

#### **IRT Chart Increments**

The attached IRT chart was effective beginning October 1, 2012. The figures on the chart for all AU sizes in both Regions are based on the October 2012 CalFresh gross income limits. This year, CalFresh gross income limits which are 130 percent of the FPL are higher than the amount that would render an AU financially ineligible for CalWORKs; therefore, this year's IRT levels are based on the CalFresh gross income limits. Although the attached IRT levels were effective beginning October 1, 2012, CWDs shall not retroactively apply the 2012-13 IRT. The new IRT level will apply as soon as the CWD updates the recipient of the new 2012-13 IRT.

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An entry of zero to the IRT Chart is to reflect the IRT amount for a reporting size of zero. This is to address those relatively rare occurrences in which no person's needs are considered in determining the CalWORKs cash aid amount. An example of this would be a case in which the only eligible child is a Maximum Family Grant child and his/her caretaker relative (parent) is either being sanctioned or penalized and there are no other persons in the home whose needs are considered in the Family MAP. In this situation, the MAP amount is zero and the IRT is \$114. We arrive at the IRT level for an AU size of zero using the following formula:  $$0 \times 2 + 112 + 1 = 113$  (income limit). This calculation reflects the use of the CalWORKs Earned Income Disregards. One additional dollar is added to the income limit of \$113 to make the IRT \$114 for the AU size of zero.

# Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA)/Entrant Cash Assistance (ECA) and Trafficking and Crime Victims Assistance Programs (TCVAP)

The above instructions regarding the IRT also apply to the RCA/ECA Program in accordance with MPP Sections 69-201.4 and 69-301, which state that CalWORKs Program regulations relating to financial eligibility and payments apply to RCA/ECA unless specifically superseded by RCA/ECA regulations (i.e., MPP Section 69-206, which exempts specific income and resources from the income eligibility determination process). The above instructions regarding the IRT also apply to TCVAP.

<sup>\*</sup> The figures on the chart for all AU sizes in both regions are based on the October 2012 CalFresh gross income limits (130 percent of FPL). This year, CalFresh gross income limits are higher than the CalWORKs MAP levels for all reporting sizes in both Regions. Therefore, income at 130 percent of FPL or greater would render the family financially ineligible. The CalWORKs MAP levels were not used to establish the IRT.
