SUBJECT: ANNUAL CHILD WELFARE SERVICES (CWS) DISASTER

RESPONSE PLAN UPDATE

REFERENCE: CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2006

This letter is being sent to all 58 county Child Welfare Services (CWS) and Probation Departments to request an annual update to the CWS Disaster Response Plan previously submitted to the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) in 2015.

The Governor declared a State of Emergency for 21 counties in 2015. The CDSS sent the Disaster Questionnaire (DQ), which is used as an offset to the CWS Disaster Plan Template for an immediate status of counties affected when a disaster occurs. The CDSS reviewed the DQ's and verbal responses from the counties and learned that many counties were concerned about the efficiency of their county's tools used to locate dependent, probation, and non-minor children during a disaster. As a result, the CDSS conducted a survey of all the counties to identify the problematic areas and Criteria A on the 2016 CWS Disaster Plan Template was updated to reflect these concerns. All other criteria on the CWS Disaster Plan Template remain the same.

Pursuant to the Child and Family Services Improvement Act of 2006, PL 109-288, Section 6 (16); Part B Section 422 of Title IV of the Social Security Act; and Senate Bill 703, Chapter 583, Section 29 (c) Statutes of 2007; and the WIC Section 16500.1(c)(1); the CDSS as the single state agency is mandated to oversee CWS Disaster Response Plans for California. It is in this capacity that the CDSS is requesting each county

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update current changes, as indicated below, of the CWS Disaster Response Plan by using the template attached to this letter.

Disaster response plans must include procedures describing how the county will do the following:

- A. Identify, locate, and continue availability of services for CWS children, Probation children, non-minor dependents, including non-minor dependents residing in foster care, out-of-county placements, children placed in or out of California through the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC), and out-of-state non-minor dependents under county care or supervision who are displaced or adversely affected by a disaster;
- B. Respond, as appropriate, to new CWS cases in areas adversely affected by a disaster and provide services in those cases;
- C. Address and provide care for unaccompanied minors;
- D. Remain in communication with caseworkers and other essential child welfare personnel who are displaced because of a disaster;
- E. Preserve essential program records; and
- F. Coordinate services and share information with other states and counties. Include a description of the process utilized by the county to ensure that information regarding children placed pursuant to the ICPC occurs with both the sending state and the CDSS.

The CWS Disaster Response Plan's Criteria A has been revised. The revision includes updates for Probation children, non-minor dependents residing in foster care, and out-of-county placement. The ICPC updates were added in 2014. The ICPC is federal and state law which governs the placement of children out-of-state.

Probation children in CWS care receiving Title IV-E foster care are to be included in the plan. In order to identify, locate, and continue availability of services for these children, the plan requires that local Probation Departments have an Interagency Agreement and a Memorandum of Understanding in place that permits the sharing of specific information regarding probation children during a disaster. Counties are requested to provide a copy of their updated CWS Disaster Response Plans to the CDSS by July 6, 2016.

This template is intended to be used as a guide to help counties incorporate the 2006 federal disaster response criteria as part of local child welfare plans regarding children and non-minor dependents. Children and non-minor dependents in the probation system must also be included in the plan. County plans must be amended annually to include Child Welfare Services (CWS) Disaster Response Plans.

In September 2006, Congress passed the Child and Family Services Improvement Act of 2006 (Public Law [PL] 109-288). PL 109-288 amended Part B of Title IV of the Social Security Act to reauthorize the Promoting Safe and Stable Families Program. Among other changes, PL 109-288 established requirements for states on disaster planning in child welfare under section 6(a)-(16) and Welfare and Institutions Code Section 16500.1(c)(1). Accordingly, counties are requested to address the following program areas in developing local disaster readiness plans.
