SUBJECT: DISASTER GUIDANCE ATTACHMENT- DISASTER SUPPLEMENTAL

NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM/DISASTER FOOD STAMP PROGRAM INCOME ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS AND ALLOTMENTS

EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2009

This letter is to inform counties that the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has issued a new Disaster Guidance Attachment effective April 1, 2009. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 that was signed into law by President Obama on February 17, 2009, created a 13.6 percent temporary increase in the food stamp benefit allotments, among other provisions. The temporary benefit increase also applies to the Disaster Food Stamp Program (DFSP) Income Eligibility Standards and Allotments that are effective April 1, 2009. The following provision of the ARRA will also apply to DFSP benefits:

 The increased DFSP benefit amount for a household will not be considered in an overissuance determination. All County Information Notice No. I-38-09 Page Two

Please note that the DFSP Income Eligibility Standards remain the same. The maximum shelter deduction is \$446 and the standard deduction is between \$144 and \$197, depending on household size. For more information, please reference All-County Information Notice I-72-08. Additional instructions will be forthcoming shortly on how to disregard the ARRA benefit increase in the calculation of a DFSP overissuance.
