The purpose of this letter is to remind county welfare departments (CWDs) they must develop written policies and procedures for those sections of the CalWORKs program in which they have operational discretion. In addition to the development of written policies and procedures, CDSS strongly encourages counties to place the information on their own county department websites as soon as administratively possible to maximize access for all applicants and recipients of the CalWORKs program.

Manual of Policies and Procedures (MPP) Section 11-501.3 requires, for those areas of the CalWORKs program in which CWDs have discretion to adopt specific standards that affect a client's eligibility, grant amount, and welfare-to-work activities, including supportive services, policies and procedures must be in writing and be made available to the public upon request.

Having written policies and procedures ensures the following:

- ✓ Access to and knowledge of applicable program rules for CWD staff, applicants for and recipients of aid, and other interested parties;
- ✓ Uniform and equitable treatment of clients;

- ✓ CWDs staff actions are based on standardized county procedures; and
- ✓ CWD actions will be further supported in State hearings.

To be effective, these policies and procedures must contain sufficient details so that the county's criteria related to program requirements and participation can be clearly understood. Having this information available on CWD websites will further promote a more uniform and equitable treatment of those individuals accessing the benefits and services that the CalWORKs program offers.

To assist in identifying the CalWORKs policies and procedures counties have the responsibility to adopt in writing, please refer to the attached list. This list is not all inclusive; counties must document other policy or procedures used in the determination of eligibility or services for their clients.
