SUBJECT: COUNTY CHILDREN'S TRUST FUND SHARE OF KID'S PLATE REVENUE

The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) is pleased to inform you that within the next 90 days Kid's Plate revenue for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2006-2007 will be distributed.

The total revenue for SFY 2006-2007 is \$878,000. Each county's share is based on their proportion of the State's population of children, ages 0–18, as reported by Department of Finance statistics starting July 2006. The allocations for each fiscal year are shown on the enclosed charts (Enclosure A).

The California Department of Motor Vehicles generates the Kid's Plate revenue from initial and renewal fees for custom and sequential California "Kids" vehicle license plates. The intent of the revenue is to strengthen the health and safety protections for children and to help fund programs to reduce child injury and child abuse. Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 18285 and Motor Vehicle Code Section 5072, Kid's Plate revenue is deposited in the Child Health and Safety Fund. Statute requires that it be distributed as follows:

- 50 percent to the Community Care Licensing Division within CDSS.
- 25 percent to the Childhood Injury Control Program within the State California Department of Health Services.
- 22.5 percent to County Children's Trust Funds.
- 2.5 percent to the State's Children's Trust Fund.

To facilitate your efforts toward preventing child abuse and neglect, CDSS encourages you to coordinate the use of the Kid's Plate revenue with your Child Abuse Prevention, Intervention and Treatment funds, the Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention funds, and the Promoting Safe and Stable Families funds.
