This is to inform you of developments in the case of <u>Darces v. Woods</u>. This case was filed on April 9, 1980 and challenged the <u>Department's policy</u> of considering all of an unaided parent's income to be available to the aided children when there are unaided children in the home. In this case, the unaided parent and children were ineligible because of their illegal alien status.

The Department's position was upheld at the trial and appellate court levels. The plaintiffs appealed to the California Supreme Court. On April 20, 1984 the California Supreme Court issued an opinion ruling in favor of plaintiffs. The majority opinion found that the Department's policy of not considering the needs of the undocumented children in determining the grant to the Assistance Unit was a violation of equal protection under the State Constitution. The Court instructed the trial court to grant plaintiff's Motion for Summary Judgment.

The Department has reviewed the Supreme Court's opinion, and has requested a rehearing to seek guidance for the upcoming trial court proceedings on Summary Judgment.
