SUBJECT: CORRECTION TO ACL 10-43 END OF TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF) EMERGENCY CONTINGENCY FUNDS (ECF) PROGRAM AND RESUMPTION OF ASSEMBLY BILL (AB) 98 PROVISIONS

REFERENCE: ALL COUNTY LETTER (ACL) 10-43, COUNTY FISCAL LETTER (CFL) 10/11-36

The purpose of this erratum to ACL 10-43 (October 1, 2010) is to correct an issue regarding third-party funding for subsidized employment programs under AB 98 (Chapter 589, Statutes of 2007).

Question 6 in the question and answer attachment to ACL 10-43 asked whether a county could use an alternate funding source (other than the county Single Allocation) for the county share of a subsidized employment program under AB 98. The original answer to the question indicated that “in-kind” contributions are allowable for third party funding of wage subsidies. However, this statement is incorrect as in-kind contributions are not allowed under AB 98. The answer to question 6 should read as follows:

**Corrected Response:** Yes, provided there is a written agreement with the source of third-party funds. The agreement must ensure that the third party is aware of and agrees to allow the state to count the contribution of funds toward the state’s Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement. The agreement must specify that the third party’s contribution is not funded through federal funds or through funds that are used or will be used to satisfy a cost-sharing or matching requirement of another federal

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program (non-TANF). California Department of Social Services (CDSS) will be issuing instructions separately for claiming such costs.
