SUBJECT: SERVER BASED COMPUTING (SBC) SYSTEM TOKENS FOR ACCESS TO

THE CHILD WELFARE SERVICES/CASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

(CWS/CMS)

REFERENCE: ALL COUNTY INFORMATION NOTICE (ACIN) NO. 1-03-11

The purpose of this All County Letter (ACL) is to provide additional policy direction regarding SBC Tokens. The ACIN 1-03-11 was issued as instruction to remedy incorrect assumptions regarding the use of SBC tokens that had resulted in the underutilization of the assets. This ACL is to notify the County Child Welfare and Probation Departments that they are required to take all possible measures to assure that tokens issued by the state are utilized in enabling remote access to the CWS/CMS.

Currently, a significant number of state-issued tokens are not being used. These are non-performing assets with subsequent use costs. Due in part to our current fiscal environment as well as the objective of meeting the needs of all CWS/CMS users across the state, the California Department of Social Services is requesting the return of all unused tokens regardless of whether they have been deployed to staff. The state will redeploy these tokens based on immediate county need. Should a county need help identifying their unused tokens, the state will continue to provide a listing to aid the county as all tokens are tracked by an identification number and authorized user name.

For counties that are in the near-term process of utilizing particular tokens, (not to be confused with merely deploying the tokens), a 30-day deployment plan should be submitted to the CWS/CMS SBC Administrator e-mail box. Any token that is not scheduled for deployment should be returned immediately. If at the end of this 30-day period the recently deployed tokens continue to be reflected as unused, they must be identified and returned, as soon as possible. Tokens are managed by a county administrator through the CWS/CMS SBC application. Please contact your county SBC administrator if a future need arises for new or replacement tokens. 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Please see the chart below for a brief overview of the parameters under which counties should manage their token assets:
