The purpose of this erratum is to add the CNI increase that is applicable to the Intensive Treatment Foster Care/Multidimensional Treatment Foster Care (ITFC/MTFC) rates for fiscal year (FY) 2015-16. In addition, we are clarifying the increased amount displayed in the social work portion of the Foster Family Agency (FFA) rate.

Intensive Treatment Foster Care/Multidimensional Treatment Foster Care

SB 79, Chapter 20, Statutes of 2015, extended the interim rates through December 31, 2016. Effective July 1, 2015, the 2.54 percent CNI increase applies to the minimum reimbursement rate which results in a corresponding increase to the standard rate.

Additionally, children may not be placed at a Rate Level I or II for more than six months unless it is determined to be in the best interest of the child by the child's county interagency review team or the county placing agency, FFA and the child's certified foster parents. Extensions may be granted in six month increments.

Foster Family Agencies

Effective July 1, 2015, the 2.54 percent CNI increase applies to the FFA basic portion of the rates only and does not change the remaining components of the FFA treatment program rate as outlined in the Manual of Policies and Procedures section 11-403. As required by regulation, a minimum of the basic rate and the child increment are to be passed on to the FFA certified home for each child each month. The social work portion received a 15 percent increase for FY 2015-16 which is consistent with the Continuum of Care Reform recommended changes. The FY 2015-16 FFA rates are reflected in Table B and Table C.
