SUBJECT: WAIVER OF THE FOOD STAMP WORK REQUIREMENT FOR ABLE-BODIED ADULTS WITHOUT DEPENDENTS (ABAWDS)

REFERENCE: ALL-COUNTY LETTER NO. 97-16

This is to inform you that the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food and Consumer Service, has provided authority to waive the Food Stamp ABAWD work requirement in 42 entire counties and in parts of 11 other counties. The waiver is effective retroactively to December 1, 1996. The waiver granted by USDA does not cover five counties. (See Attachment I for the breakdown of counties and Attachment II for the specific areas in the partially-waived counties).

CDSS sought a statewide waiver of the Food Stamp ABAWD work provisions in order to provide counties additional time to inform the impacted population and to develop activities which would enable individuals to meet the work requirements. However, USDA granted waiver authority for counties and parts of counties that either had an unemployment rate over 10 percent or were deemed to be a Labor Surplus Area (an area that had an average unemployment rate for the most recent 24-month period which was 20 percent higher than the national average).

Based on USDA's action, each county with waiver authority should determine whether it is now prepared to implement the Food Stamp ABAWD work provisions or if it will accept the waiver. Therefore, depending on the availability of waiver authority and the county's choice regarding implementation, action should be taken as indicated on Attachment III. All County Letter Page Two
