### Training and technical assistance provided to family support agencies

The Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP) believes families and communities are strengthened when training and technical assistance is provided to family support agencies, counties and communities. Strategies 2.0 offers support in such areas as cultural competence, family engagement, systems improvement, and more. The practical application of research and best practices has led Strategies 2.0 to train and assist programs throughout the State.

Through a new tri-agency collaborative with San Diego State University Social Policy Institute, The Child Abuse Prevention Center, and Children's Bureau, Strategies 2.0 serves as a capacity builder by helping family support agencies, networks, and organizations to:

- » Implement E-Learning training opportunities
- » Engage in learning communities
- » Provide quality child abuse prevention services
- » Improve organizational management
- » Engage in strategic planning
- » Design and implement sustainability plans
- » Implement promising practices that promote child safety, permanence and well-being
- » Develop family resource centers/family support organizations, networks, and public/private partnerships
- » Address emerging initiatives and issues impacting the family support field

The Strategies 2.0 grant cycle began in July of 2016 and will conclude in June of 2019.
