 - "(2) The facility submits to the department, with the notification, a physician and surgeon's written statement to the effect that the resident's illness or recovery is of a temporary nature. The statement shall contain an estimated date upon which the illness or recovery will end or upon which the resident will no longer be confined to a bed.
 - "(3) The department determines that the health and safety of the resident is adequately protected in that facility and that transfer to a higher level of care is not necessary.
 - "(4) This section does not expand the scope of care and supervision of a residential care facility for the elderly."

- (1) If it is determined that a resident will be temporarily bedridden for more than 14 days, the facility shall notify the fire authority having jurisdiction of the revised estimated length of time that the resident will be bedridden, as required in Section 87714(b).
- (f) In addition to meeting the requirements specified in Section 87208, the plan of operation shall address the needs of bedridden residents, including, but not necessarily limited to, brief narrative descriptions of the following:
 - (1) Type of care to be provided, including goals and objectives.
 - (2) Descriptions of the licensee's plans to meet each of the requirements of Section 87714(g).
 - (3) Procedures for notifying, when a resident's condition changes or an incident occurs that threatens the health and safety of the resident, the resident's physician, as appropriate; the resident's responsible person or conservator, if any; and any family member who has requested notification.

- (g) Licensees who accept or retain bedridden residents shall ensure the following:
 - (1) In accordance with Section 87467, Resident Participation in Decision Making, a care plan to meet each bedridden resident's needs is developed, followed and updated as the resident's condition changes.
 - (A) The resident's physician, or a licensed health care professional designated by the resident's physician, shall be consulted on the development of the care plan.
 - (B) The licensee shall ensure that each care plan is kept current and accurately matches the services being provided, and that the resident's needs are met at all times.
 - Each bedridden resident has an updated medical assessment if necessary, as specified in Section 87458(c), and reappraisals are done as frequently as necessary, as specified in Section 87463.
 - (A) Any updated medical assessment and reappraisal(s) shall include an assessment of the resident's bedridden care needs.
 - (B) When a medical assessment, reappraisal or observation indicates that the resident's bedridden care needs have changed, corresponding changes shall be made in the care and supervision provided to that resident and shall be reflected in the resident's care plan required in Section 87714(g)(1).
 - (3) In addition to the on-the-job training requirements in Section 87411(d), direct care staff who care for bedridden residents meet the training requirements of Section 87613, General Requirements for Restricted Health Conditions.
 - (A) Training for direct care staff who care for bedridden residents shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - 1. Proper procedures for repositioning residents when necessary;
 - 2. Evaluation of skin integrity;
 - 3. <u>Infection control</u>;
 - 4. Appropriate nutritional and fluid intake;
 - 5. Use of assistive devices and equipment;

- 6. Techniques for providing bedridden residents with sensory stimulation, such as reading aloud to residents or the use of audio/video tapes;
- 7. Any techniques that a trained layperson can perform to help prevent respiratory complications such as pneumonia, gastrointestinal motility disorders such as constipation, and bladder problems in bedridden residents;
- <u>8.</u> How to recognize when a bedridden resident is in distress and needs medical intervention; and
- 9. Have knowledge of and training to carry out the emergency disaster plan required in Section 87212.
- (4) Documentation of bedridden-related staff training, as required in Sections 87714(g)(3) and (g)(3)(A), is maintained in the personnel records as specified in Sections 87411(c)(6) and 87412(c)(2).
- (5) In accordance with the personnel requirements specified in Section 87411(a), there is an adequate number of trained direct care staff to meet each bedridden resident's needs as identified in his/her current care plan required in Section 87714(g)(1).
- (6) In addition to the requirements specified in Section 87415, Night Supervision, awake night staff on duty or on call are capable of meeting the repositioning and other needs of bedridden residents, as necessary.
 - (A) In addition to the requirements in Section 87415(a), a facility with fewer than 16 residents shall have at least one night staff person awake, on duty, and capable of meeting the repositioning and other needs of bedridden residents, as necessary, if any bedridden resident is determined to require constant or intermittent awake night supervision in his/her current care plan required in Section 87714(g)(1).
- (7) In addition to the requirements specified in Section 87303(i), facilities licensed for fewer than 16 residents that care for a bedridden resident(s) have and utilize a signal system or other appropriate means of communication that enables the bedridden resident(s) to summon facility staff immediately when needed.
- (8) There is ongoing, prompt access to licensed health care professionals for consultation on bedridden issues or the specific needs of a bedridden resident(s), as necessary.
- (9) Assistive devices and equipment are available and utilized as necessary to meet the needs of bedridden residents. Assistive devices and equipment may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (A) Egg-crate mattresses (or equivalent) to relieve pressure;
- (B) Partial bed rails;
- (C) Privacy curtains and/or screens, if necessary;
- (D) Over-bed tables;
- (E) Heel and elbow protectors;
- (F) Bed pans;
- (G) Bedside commodes;
- (H) Urinals;
- (I) Trapeze bars;
- (J) Patient lifts; and
- (K) Wheelchairs.
- (10) In addition to Section 87219, Planned Activities, there are planned activities that address the needs and limitations of bedridden residents, including the need for sensory stimulation.
- (h) <u>In addition to the reporting requirements specified in Section 87211, the licensee shall ensure the following for its bedridden residents:</u>
 - (1) When there is any change in a bedridden resident's health condition that threatens the health and safety of the resident, the physician, home health care agency, hospice provider, and authorized representative or conservator, if any, of the resident are contacted.
 - (2) Reports required by this section and Section 87211 shall be made by telephone within one working day, and in writing within seven calendar days; and shall specify all of the following:
 - (A) The name, age and sex of each affected resident.
 - (B) The date and nature of the reportable event, as well as any pertinent background information about the circumstances leading up to the event.
 - (C) Actions taken by the licensee and any other parties to resolve the reportable event and to prevent similar occurrences in the future.

- (i) The facility's emergency disaster plan, required by Section 87212, shall address safety issues pertaining to bedridden residents in a disaster or an emergency.
- (j) Nothing contained in this section or in Chapter 8 precludes the licensing agency from requiring the relocation of a bedridden resident whose needs are not being met in a facility, or whose needs are beyond the scope of care of the facility.
