

This version of the *Notes from the Training Bureau* deletes many paraphrased regulations (ParaRegs) from the printed copy of the CalWORKs, food stamps and Medi-Cal sections. At the request of many, we have undertaken to reduce the size of the printed ParaRegs by removing duplicate, obsolete and seldom-used ParaRegs. This change will not affect laptop users who will continue to have access to all the ParaRegs that previously were in the printed copy. (The code numbers for the ParaRegs which have been deleted in the printed version begin with an "S" in the laptop version).

In addition to the above, there are three additional changes: two regulations have been added (062-2A and 438-5B) and one has been revised (437-4A).

In order to streamline the printed copy of the ParaRegs, many ParaRegs that appeared in multiple sections were deleted from one section. Estoppel ParaRegs (in section 209) not specific to food stamps were deleted because they already appear in the CalWORKs section. Real property ParaRegs in CalWORKs (090s) and Medi-Cal (490s) that addressed general property concepts and are not specific to real property were deleted because they appear in the applicable personal property section. Several references to All-County Letter 03-18 regarding quarterly reporting were deleted from the food stamp section (227) because they appear in the CalWORKs section (026).

ParaRegs will continue to be deleted from the printed copy of the ParaRegs on an ongoing basis. Many ParaRegs that were candidates for deletion from the printed copy were left in. If any judge thinks that additional ParaRegs should be deleted from the printed version, please notify the Quality Improvement Bureau of the specific ParaRegs that you suggest to be deleted.

ITEM 04-8-2: Paraphrased Regulations

This version of the paraphrased regulations provides additions and revisions to food stamp quarterly reporting/prospective budgeting (QR/PB) regulations. There are 49 new paraphrased regulations and 66 revised ones.

The new food stamp quarterly reporting regulations are effective July 1, 2004. All 58 counties actually began implementing quarterly reporting by June 1, 2004 or earlier. Thus if there is a QR/PB issue for any time period prior to July 1, 2004, the proper authority would be All County Letter (ACL) 03-18 and the other ACLs and All County Information Notices (ACIN) on QR/PB. Those ACLs and ACINs are listed on the front page of the QR/PB outline that was issued to all judges to be used with the video training on QR/PB.

ITEM 04-8-1: Paraphrased Regulations

This version of the paraphrased regulations provides additions and revisions to CalWORKs quarterly reporting/prospective budgeting (QR/PB) regulations. There are 49 new paraphrased regulations and 46 revised ones. There will be a QR/PB paraphrased regulation package on food stamps issued later in August.

The new CalWORKs quarterly reporting regulations are effective July 1, 2004. All 58 counties actually began implementing quarterly reporting by June 1, 2004 or earlier. Thus if there is a QR/PB issue for any time period prior to July 1, 2004, the proper authority would be All County Letter (ACL) 03-18 and the other ACLs and All County Information Notices (ACIN) on QR/PB. Those ACLs and ACINs are listed on the front page of the QR/PB outline that was issued to all judges to be used with the video training on QR/PB.

ITEM 04-6-1: Paraphrased Regulations

This version of the paraphrased regulations provides additions and revisions to CalWORKs regulations as well as one addition to adult programs, one addition to legal principles and one revision in food stamps. There are 54 new paraphrased regulations and 8 revised ones.

Included in these paraphrased regulations are a summary of *Rosales v. Thompson* and All County Letter 03-43 discussing *Rosales*. As ACL 03-43 indicates, if a child cannot be linked to AFDC based on the home of the relative from whom the child was removed, the child may be linked to AFDC for federal foster care purposes to a qualified relative's home if the child would have been eligible in that home at any time during the month in which the petition was filed or in the six months prior to the petition month. This is consistent with MPP §45-202.332.

ACL 03-43 states that this applies to cases in which the petition was filed on or after April 1, 2003. The United States District Court issued an amended court order on Feb. 20, 2004 which changes the effective date of the regulation to March 3, 2003. There is still pending court action regarding retroactivity of *Rosales* and other implementation issues. This court order also orders *Rosales* to be applied retroactive to December 23, 1997 for “otherwise eligible” foster care cases open on March 3, 2003. However, this portion of the court’s order cannot be implemented via an ACL until DHHS approval is obtained, as required by Welfare and Institutions Code Section 11402.1. A pending issue, which will be addressed in upcoming court dates, is the method for determining whether a case is “otherwise eligible” for foster care benefits, which is a prerequisite to any retroactive payment. A paraphrased regulation will be added once the new ACL is issued.

ITEM 04-4-1: Paraphrased Regulations

This version of the paraphrased regulations provides additions and revisions in CAPI and food stamps as well as one paraphrased regulation citing All County Information Notice I-65-86 regarding bankruptcy. There are 30 new paraphrased regulations and 19 revised ones.

There is one new issue code (826) and two revised issue codes as follows:

215 Expedited service/Transitional Food Stamps
