The purpose of this ACL is to provide County Welfare Departments (CWDs) with the target number of extensions estimated for the Welfare-to-Work 24-Month Time Clock (WTW 24-MTC) for the January 2019 to June 2019 period.

Background

Passage of SB 1041 (Statutes of 2012) created a cumulative 24-month period, known as the WTW 24-MTC, for increased flexibility of services and activities during adults' maximum 48 months of CalWORKs aid and established conditions under which the WTW 24-MTC could be extended.

Initial guidance on the topic of extensions was issued in ACL No. 14-09, dated February 5, 2014. Instructions regarding extension criteria, determination process, and reevaluations were issued in ACL No. 15-01, dated January 9, 2015 and in ACL No. 18-41, dated April 2, 2018. The methodology used in estimating the attached extension targets was released in ACL No. 15-02, dated January 9, 2015.

Current and Past CWD 20 Percent Extension Targets

Attachment A provides information on the base population that meets the conditions in the referenced methodology and the corresponding number of available 20 percent extensions in each CWD for the current period of January 2019 to June 2019 as well as the past extension periods of July 2018 to December 2018 and January to June 2018.

Attachment B provides information on the previous target numbers for 2017 and 2016.
