The purpose of this ACL is to provide County Welfare Departments (CWDs) with the Welfare-to-Work 24-Month Time Clock (WTW 24-MTC) extension targets estimated for the January through June 2020 period.

Background

Passage of SB 1041 (Chapter 47, Statutes of 2012) created a cumulative 24-month period, known as the WTW 24-MTC, for increased flexibility of services and activities during adults' maximum 48 months of CalWORKs aid and established conditions under which the WTW 24-MTC could be extended.

The following ACLs released guidance relevant to the WTW 24-MTC extensions:

- **ACL No. 14-09:** Initial guidance on extensions;

- **ACL No. 15-01 and ACL No. 18-41:** Instructions regarding extension criteria, the determination process, and reevaluations; and,
- **ACL No. 15-02:** Described the methodology used to estimate the extension targets.

Current and Past CWD 20 Percent Extension Targets

Attachment A provides:

- The base population that meets the conditions referenced in the extension methodology (refer to ACL No. 15-02);
- The corresponding number of available 20 percent extensions in each CWD, for the current period of January through June 2020;
- The number of available 20 percent extensions in each CWD for the previous two extension periods (January through June 2019 and July through December 2019).

Attachment B provides information on the number of available 20 percent extensions in each CWD for 2018 and 2017.
