The purpose of this errata is to amend the Funding Distribution for the State Commercially Sexually Exploited Children Program - Opt-In Counties section of [ACL NO. 23-76](#). The allocation methodology for the \$488,640 reduction across all continuing counties stated in ACL 23-76 is based on each continuing county's projected FY 2022-23 state CSEC allocation balance as of July 2023. Additionally, ACL No. 23-76 states continuing counties with projected surplus balances contribute 4.77 percent of their preliminary allocation. The final methodology included in [CFL NO. 23/24-20](#) utilizes each county's actual FY 2022-23 state CSEC allocation balances as of the June 2023 quarter and continuing counties with surplus balances contribute 4.49 percent of their preliminary allocation.

**UPDATED: FUNDING DISTRIBUTION FOR THE STATE COMERCIALLY  
SEXUALLY EXPLOITED CHILDREN PROGRAM – OPT-IN COUNTIES**

- From the preliminary calculation, a reduction of \$488,640 is distributed across all continuing counties for the implementation of county training, technical assistance, and cross-county coordination through the Preventing and

Addressing Child Trafficking Project based on each continuing county's actual FY 2022-23 state CSEC allocation balance as of the June 2023 quarter. Continuing counties with surplus balances contribute 4.49 percent of their preliminary allocation; continuing counties with projected deficit balances contribute 1.0 percent of their preliminary allocation.
