The purpose of this letter is to provide County Welfare Departments (CWDs) with guidance regarding additional CalFresh emergency allotments issued under section 2302(a)(1) of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (the Act).

Background

To increase food benefits in response to Coronavirus (COVID-19) and its effects on the economy, section 2302(a)(1) of the Act provides authority for the California Department of Social Services (the Department) to provide CalFresh emergency allotments.

Since March 2020, emergency allotments have raised each household's regular monthly CalFresh allotment to the maximum allowable allotment based on household size. Previous guidance provided by the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) specified that CalFresh households already receiving the maximum allowable allotment based on household size were not eligible to receive an emergency allotment of CalFresh benefits. This guidance has recently been updated as described below. All CalFresh households are now eligible to receive an emergency allotment.

On April 2, 2020, the Department communicated to counties via [letter](#) that California was approved to provide CalFresh emergency allotments to eligible households for two months, March and April 2020. Since then, the Department has issued a monthly letter confirming the continued approval of emergency allotments. The Department will continue to issue a monthly letter confirming the approval of and issuance date for each month's emergency allotment.

The [Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021](#) includes a provision to increase all Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefit allotments by 15 percent effective January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021. The [American Rescue Plan Act, 2021](#) extends the temporary 15 percent for the period of July 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021. The SNAP benefit increase will be implemented in addition to emergency allotments. More information on the temporary benefit increase can be found in [All County Information Notice \(ACIN\) I-11-21](#) issued on January 27, 2021 and [ACIN I-24-21](#) issued on April 1, 2021.

Revised Emergency Allotment Guidance

FNS released a memo on April 1, 2021, [SNAP – Emergency Allotments](#), stating they have reviewed previous emergency allotment guidance and determined that a revised approach to emergency allotments will provide greater equity for households most in need. This revised guidance was effective beginning with the April 2021 benefit month.

Under this revised policy, all CalFresh households will receive a minimum emergency allotment of \$95 per month. This revised minimum emergency allotment applies regardless of household size. Households eligible to receive the maximum allowable allotment based on household size are now eligible to receive an emergency allotment of \$95 per month. Households who are not eligible to receive the maximum allowable allotment based on household size, but whose emergency allotment is less than \$95 per month under the previous model, will receive additional CalFresh benefits to raise their emergency allotment to the new \$95 minimum. Households who were eligible to receive more than \$95 per month under the previous model will continue to receive that amount.

Emergency Allotment Extension

Emergency allotments are approved on a month-by-month basis. The option to issue emergency allotments on a month-by-month basis will continue until the Secretary for Health and Human Services (HHS) rescinds the federal public health emergency declaration that was issued on January 27, 2020, under section 319 of the Public Health Service Act or the State-issued emergency or disaster declaration expires.

The FNS has provided guidance allowing for a one-month emergency allotment phase-out upon expiration of the State-issued emergency or disaster declaration. States may

request emergency allotment approval for one additional issuance month if the Secretary for HHS public health emergency declaration under section 319 of the Public Health Service Act remains in place, **and** the State-issued emergency or disaster declaration has expired or will expire in the current month. The Department will release county guidance via letter if the phase-out emergency allotment is implemented.

July 2021 Emergency Allotments

California has requested and been approved to issue CalFresh emergency allotments for the month of July 2021. July emergency allotments will have a client availability date of Sunday, August 8, 2021. July emergency allotments available on August 8, 2021 will reflect the revised guidance. All eligible CalFresh households will receive a minimum emergency allotment of \$95 for the month of July.

Each eligible household will only receive one emergency allotment per benefit month that emergency allotments are approved. That said, because the emergency allotment issuance process will be completed via batch process and because of potential processing delays caused by the recent increase in CalFresh application volume, California will run three issuances for each approved emergency allotment. This will ensure that all eligible households receive an emergency allotment for each benefit month that emergency allotments are approved.

It is important to note that an emergency allotment may be issued manually using benefit type CF03 in the limited circumstance that a household should have received an emergency allotment but was not issued an emergency allotment through the three batch processes scheduled for each emergency allotment benefit month.
