Dear Ms. Fernandez:

This is in response to your request of September 16, 2020, to the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS), on behalf of the California Department of Social Services (DSS) to waive SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 274.6(a)(3) and (a)(4), which restrict replacement issuances to households that timely report a loss orally or in writing, and require households to timely submit a signed affidavit attesting to food loss. Rather than require SNAP households to report their food losses through an individual affidavit, California has requested to issue automatic mass replacements for the residents that suffered food losses as a result of wildfires and power outages that began on September 7, 2020, through September 10, 2020. On September 17, 2020, the State requested to amend the waiver to withdraw zip codes 96063 and 95375.

The waiver applies 83 zip codes in the following 18 counties: Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, El Dorado, Fresno, Glenn, Humboldt, Napa, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Tehama, Tuolumne, and Yuba (see enclosure).

The State agency proposed to automatically replace 60 percent of benefits issued in September 2020 for all households residing in the 83 zip codes. The State agency estimated the active SNAP household population affected as approximately 7,757, and the estimated cost at \$869,326.

Approval for Mass Replacements

DSS provided documentation to support the fact that over 50 percent of all households in the affected zip codes lost power for more than 4 hours, due to the wildfires and power outages. Estimating the portion of the food purchased with monthly benefits that had not yet been consumed at the time of the disaster, and was therefore subject to loss, is relevant to making this determination. FNS derives a benefit replacement estimate by assuming a reasonable usage of benefits and consumption of food over the course of the month, and estimates how much food may have been lost by the average household. This estimate takes into account whether loss is limited to perishable food due to a power outage, or perishables and non-perishables due to structural damage and/or flooding.

DSS issues SNAP benefits from the first through the tenth of each month, and the wildfires and power outages began September 7, 2020, through September 10, 2020. FNS is authorizing the mass replacement of 50 percent of benefits for households that were issued September 1, 2020, through September 10, 2020, benefits in the approved zip codes.

This waiver will enable households to receive replacement benefits without having to appear in the local SNAP office to sign an affidavit attesting to food loss and will allow local DSS offices to operate the program in a more efficient and effective manner. These replacement benefits would be automatically issued to all regular SNAP households in the affected zip codes, by means of an automated credit to their Electronic Benefits Transfer cards.

This waiver does not remove the responsibility of local offices to process individual affidavits received before or after the waiver implementation, as required by 7 CFR 274.6(a). Households that have already received replacement benefits based on a signed affidavit of loss must be excluded from the mass replacement process. Furthermore, if a client submits an affidavit after receiving a mass replacement and requests an amount greater than the replacement benefit amount received, the household is only entitled to receive the difference between the requested amount and the amount previously replaced. Replacement benefits cannot exceed the maximum monthly allotment for the household.

Authority

This waiver is approved under the authority of 7 CFR 272.3(c)(1)(ii), which allows FNS to approve waivers that result in a more efficient and effective administration of the Program. Actual numbers regarding replacement values must be reported on the FNS-46 form in the Food Programs Reporting System within 90 days after issuance of the replacement benefits.
