The welfare-to-work activities discussed in this section are allowed by the Welfare-to-Work Act (WTW) of 1997 AB 1542 and the TANF Final Rule 2008. The Riverside County CalWORKs Program will use the following WTW activities for all customers:

Unsubsidized employment Job search and job readiness assistance Self-employment

The Riverside County CalWORKs Program will use the following WTW activities in a more limited way on a case-by-case basis:

Work experience On-the-job training Adult basic education Work-study Community service Job skills training directly related to employment Vocational education and training Education directly related to employment Homework time for education and training activities Supported work Subsidized private sector employment

The Riverside County CalWORKs Program will not, at this time, use the following two WTW activities:

Grant-based on-the-job training Transitional employment
