(p) COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS OF CalWORKS

Del Norte County will meet the Federal and State mandated requirements for enrollment of single parents in the Welfare-to-Work component of CalWORKs.

Single parents will be required to participate a minimum of 26 hours weekly upon enrollment, increasing to 32 hours per week beginning July 1, 1999.

The county may exercise the option to require single adults to participate 32 hours per week sooner than July 1, 1999 if sufficient participation activities are developed, and supportive services are available.

Adults in two-parent households will be required to participate 35 hours per week. The hours of participation by both adults will count toward the 35 hours, so long as one parent meets the hours required for a single parent.

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Del Norte County will meet the Federal and State mandated requirements for enrollment of single parents in the Welfare-to-Work component of CalWORKs.

Single parents will be required to participate a minimum of 26 hours weekly upon enrollment, increasing to 32 hours per week beginning July 1, 1999.

The county may exercise the option to require single adults to participate 32 hours per week sooner than July 1, 1999 if sufficient participation activities are developed, and supportive services are available. Should this occur, the county will provide an amendment to the Community CalWORKs Plan.

Adults in two-parent households will be required to participate 35 hours per week. The hours of participation by both adults will count toward the 35 hours, so long as one parent meets the hours required for a single parent.

(q) INTERACTION WITH AMERICAN INDIAN TRIBES

We have worked closely with the Yurok Tribe and the Smith River Rancheria since the inception of the CalWorks planning process. Members of these Tribes will be required to participate the county administered CalWORKs Program.

Other Native American agencies that assisted with the planning process include: Northern California Indian Development Council, United Indian Health Services, California Rural Indian Health Board and California Indian Manpower Consortium. The input from these agencies was invaluable. It is anticipated these agencies will continue to assist during the transition from AFDC to CalWorks.

The Tribal members of the Resighini and Elk Valley Rancherias will be included as eligible clients of the California Indian Manpower Consortium, Native American Employment Works (NEW) Program that is replacing the Federal JOBS Program. Coordination and referral will continue as with the former GAIN program.

The Yurok Tribe and Smith River Rancheria are taking the lead in planning Community Service Activities for Del Norte County CalWORKs recipients.

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The Tribal members of the Resighini and Elk Valley Rancherias will be included as eligible clients of the California Indian Manpower Consortium, Native American Employment Works (NEW) Program that is replacing the Federal JOBS Program. Coordination and referral will continue as with the former GAIN program in order to insure that participation requirements for Del Norte County residents in the NEW Program meet the hours of participation required by the Community CalWORKs Plan.

The Yurok Tribe and Smith River Rancheria are taking the lead in planning Community Service Activities for Del Norte County CalWORKs recipients.



- (5) If SCT determines participant is job ready, or could be within 120 days, individual is directly referred t Employment Training Programs or CalWORKS Community Service (Temporary work crews for public and private, non profit sector for transitional work experience).
- (4) An Individualized Family Plan is agreed to and signed b participant and the SCT.
- (3) Referral to Services Coordination Team(s) (SCT) determine needs and provide services.
- (2) Persons eligible receive initial orientation/identification of potential barriers to employment; non-eligible are referred to other services and employment information.
- (1) Applicants enter at Eligibility Center.
