## The Attachment for County Fiscal Letter (CFL) 16/17-03 has been revised.

This letter informs counties of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17 allocation for the Trafficking and Crime Victims Assistance Program (TCVAP) related to the administration, child care and services costs. A total of \$6.7 million General Fund (GF) is available based on the Budget Act of 2016, as shown in the attachment.

In consultation with the County Welfare Directors Association, the FY 2016-17 TCVAP allocation was adjusted to ensure that all counties were held harmless to their prior year (FY 2015-16) allocation. The funding was then distributed based on each county's percent to total of the TCVAP client count survey as of December 2015. As such, the FY 2016-17 allocation includes an increase of \$1.58 million GF above the FY 2015-16 allocation level. As a reminder, counties have the flexibility to spend their allocations across program areas and activities if needed.

Funding for the TCVAP is provided for three categories of services: Administration, Child Care and Services. Administration funds are for the administrative costs associated with managing the TCVAP Cash Assistance program. California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Child Care funding covers both services and administration costs. ## **Claiming Instructions**

Counties may claim administrative costs to Program Code (PC) 713 TCVAP Noncitizen Administrative and service and child care costs to PC 714 TCVAP Noncitizen Services. Both PCs are 100 percent GF with no county share of cost. Expenditures that exceed the state allocation will be transferred to county-only share via State Use Only Code 715.
