We are pleased to inform you that within the next 90 days we will be distributing Kids' Plate revenue for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2009-2010. The total revenue for SFY 2008-2009 is \$1,264,000. Each county's share is based on their proportion of the State's children's population age 0-18 as reported by Department of Finance statistics starting July 2008. The allocations for each fiscal year are shown on the enclosed charts (Attachment A).

The California Department of Motor Vehicles generates the Kids' Plate revenue from initial and renewal fees for custom and sequential California "Kids" vehicle license plates. The intent of the revenue is to strengthen health and safety protections for children and to help fund programs to reduce child injury and child abuse. Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 18285 and Vehicle Code Section 5072, Kids' Plate revenue is deposited into the Child Health and Safety Fund. Statute requires that it be distributed as follows:

- 50 percent to the Child Day Care Licensing Unit of the Community Care Licensing Division within the California Department of Social Services,
- 25 percent to the Childhood Injury Control Program within the California Department of Public Health,
- 22.5 percent to County Children's Trust Funds, and
- 2.5 percent to the State Children's Trust Fund.

To facilitate your efforts toward preventing child abuse and neglect, we encourage you to coordinate the use of the Kids' Plate revenue with other funds provided for Child Abuse Prevention, Intervention and Treatment; Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention; and Promoting Safe and Stable Families.
