This legislation adds Welfare and Institutions Code (W&IC), Section 607.5 to ensure that wards who have been in foster care pursuant to either W&IC 300 or 727 receive a written notice regarding any and all services for which they **may** be eligible. More specifically, when the juvenile court terminates jurisdiction over a ward who was previously in foster care as a dependent, or when a ward is released from a facility that is not a foster care facility, the probation or parole officer is **required** to provide the youth with the following information:

- A written notice stating that the person is a former foster child and may be eligible for the services and benefits that are available to a former foster child through public and private programs; and
- Information including, but not limited to, the availability of federal and state programs that provide financial assistance, housing, and educational resources for which the person may be eligible; and
- Information about the availability of federal and state independent living programs for youth 16 years and older who may be eligible.

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This legislation does not alter or amend the obligations of probation officers but clarifies existing obligations under other laws and regulations. The bill specifically permits the use of the proof of dependency and wardship document described in All County Letter ACL 07-33 on the California Department of Social Services website: https://www.cdss.ca.gov/lettersnotices/entres/getinfo/acl07/pdf/07-33.pdf
