SUBJECT: CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT ACT (CAPTA) UPDATE AND THE APPLICATION AND ALLOCATIONS FOR THE CBCAP

REFERENCE: ALL COUNTY INFORMATION NOTICE NO. I-48-11

The purpose of this letter is to provide update information regarding the CAPTA Reauthorization Act of 2010 and to release the CBCAP application and allocations. In order to support local prevention and early intervention efforts statewide, the California Department of Social Services utilizes this annual application and allocation process for county administered child welfare agencies.

The CBCAP was established by Title II of the CAPTA Amendments of 1996 and was most recently reauthorized in December of 2010 (Public Law 111-320). The CAPTA reauthorization includes the following updates for the CBCAP program:

- 1) Funds can be utilized to target services to homeless families and those at risk of homelessness, unaccompanied homeless youth and adult former victims of child abuse and neglect and domestic violence.
- 2) Funds can be utilized to provide substance abuse treatment services to at risk families.

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> 3) Funds can be utilized to involve parents in the planning and program implementation of CBCAP services/programs. Counties shall demonstrate a commitment to involving parents in the planning and program implementation including involvement of parents of children with disabilities, parents who are individuals with disabilities, racial and ethnic minorities, and members of other underrepresented or underserved groups.

The Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP), Annual Report for 2011-2012 will be revised to comply with federal reporting requirements. In particular, the annual report will be expanded to include services and participation rates for homeless families and those at risk of homelessness, homeless youth services and substance abuse treatment services. The OCAP acknowledges that counties may not be currently capturing participant rates for these services and therefore may not be able to provide this information for the 2011-2012 Annual Report. However, these participation rates <u>must</u> be captured and reported for the 2012-2013 Annual Report.

Release of the State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2011-2012 CBCAP allocations is pending receipt of the following:

1) Annual Report

As described in ACIN I-48-11, the 2010-2011 Annual Report including the narrative template, completion of the CAPIT/CBCAP/PSSF/County Children's Trust Fund (CCTF) surveys and the checklist and signature sheet. All components of the annual report are due to the OCAP **by Friday, October 14, 2011**.

- 2) CBCAP Application and Assurances Form (Attachment A)
 - The CBCAP Application and Assurance Form for SFY 2011-2012 serves as the county's formal application for CBCAP funds and assures the OCAP that CBCAP funds expended during the SFY will comply with all state and federal requirements. The CBCAP Application and Assurance Form must contain **original signatures in blue ink.** The CBCAP Application and Assurances Form (Attachment A) is due by **Friday**, **November 4, 2011.**

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> 3) <u>Certification of the CCTF Revenue Form (Attachment B)</u> The CCTF form for SFY 2010-2011 must be completed and signed by the county's authorized representative. It is essential that the information on the CCTF form reflect complete and accurate information since this information will be utilized to determine SFY 2012-2013 allocations. The CCTF form must contain **original signatures in blue ink.** The Certification of the CCTF Revenue Form (Attachment B) is due by **Friday, November 4, 2011.**

Copies of the CBCAP Application and Assurances and the CCTF forms are attached to this ACIN or may be downloaded from <u>http://www.cdsscounties.ca.gov</u>.

The CBCAP allocation (Attachment C) is based in part by the total annual birth certificate fees received by each county and reported to the OCAP on the CCTF Revenue Form for SFY 2009-10. The CBCAP funding methodology is provided in Attachment D. In addition, the CBCAP allocation must be expended during SFY 2011-2012 in accordance with each county's approved OCAP Plan currently in effect.

The undersigned agrees to and assures that (1) in accordance with California Welfare and Institutions Code (W&IC) section 18966.1(a)(3)(d), the allocation of CBCAP funds to counties shall be contingent upon assurances that the counties will provide the OCAP all information necessary to meet federal reporting mandates, (2) funds received under this title will supplement, not supplant, other state and local public funds designated for community-based prevention and early intervention programs, (3) program and activities funded under the CBCAP program shall give priority to effective community-based programs serving low-income communities and those serving young parents or parents with young children, (4) demonstrate a commitment to involving parents in the planning and program implementation (5) provide leadership in mobilizing local public and private resources to support the provision of needed child abuse and neglect prevention program and services.

ATTACHMENT C

Allocation Methodology for Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) Funds For State Fiscal Year 2011-2012

BASE ALLOCATION

In accordance with the Welfare and Institutions Code (W&IC) Section 18966.1(a), CBCAP funds are allocated annually as follows:

- (1) Counties receiving less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the year in their County Children's Trust Fund (CCTF) from birth certificate fees are granted the difference from CBCAP funds necessary to bring the trust fund up to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000). The CBCAP funds deposited into the CCTF must adhere to CBCAP requirements.
- (2) The balance remaining after (1) is distributed equally among all the counties, up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per county.
- (3) If CBCAP funds exist after (1) and (2) have been implemented, the remaining CBCAP funds are apportioned by child population percentages of participating counties. This allocation uses current data from the Department of Finance.
