The California Department of Social Services (CDSS), Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP) is very pleased to partner with Parents Anonymous[®] Inc. in promoting National Parent Leadership Month in February 2006. The CDSS is committed to strengthening families and preventing child abuse through the promotion and implementation of Parent Leadership strategies throughout the State. The purpose of National Parent Leadership Month is to:

- Raise public awareness about the important roles parents play in shaping the lives of children and families.
- Expand opportunities for Parent Leaders to participate in meaningful leadership activities.
- Recognize individual Parent Leaders whose contributions make a positive difference to their families and communities.
