TO: ALL COUNTY WELFARE DIRECTORS

SUBJECT: FOOD STAMP QC RESULTS, OCTOBER 1986-MARCH 1987 REPORTING PERIOD

For your information and corrective action planning purposes, we are sending you Table 5E of the Food Stamp Quality Control Management Information System (QCMIS). This table summarizes Food Stamp error rates for the QC period shown above.

Please note that the county error rates shown in the last column are statistically meaningful only for Los Angeles, San Diego, and the eleven other expanded QC sample counties (marked by an asterisk on the attached page). Data for all other counties is not considered statistically reliable because of the limited number of cases reviewed in each county. A complete set of Food Stamp QCMIS tables for your county has been sent to your Food Stamp Corrective Action Coordinator along with instructions for implementing the new Corrective Action Plan reporting process.

I am very concerned about California's Food Stamp error rate and extremely disappointed that the results of the October 1986-March 1987 period show an increase of 0.6 percentage points, to 8.4 percent from 7.8 percent.

In response the Department is implementing a stepped-up program of focusing on Food Stamp corrective action. The new process requires all counties to provide a complete picture of their corrective action planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation activities. The new process aligns Food Stamp corrective action planning with that for AFDC, with both programs using the same reporting cycle and format. Therefore, the next Food Stamp Corrective Action Plan (CAP) is due January 15, 1988.

I am confident that the new QC system and planning process will be of great assistance in helping you reduce your Food Stamp error rate and I look forward to having the opportunity to recognize your achievements.
