SUBJECT: KINSHIP/FOSTER CARE EMERGENCY FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2001-02

In recognition of the number and importance of foster children placed with relative caregivers on an emergency basis, the Kinship/Foster Care Emergency Fund was established in FY 2000-01. Contingent upon approval of the State Budget, \$1 million in total funds will be made available in FY 2001-02 to allow counties to facilitate such placements. The purpose of the Kinship/Foster Care Emergency Fund is to enable successful placements with relative caregivers and foster parents by removing some of the barriers that can stand in the way of emergency placements. The fund can also assist in helping retain placements when extenuating circumstances may alter a stable relative placement.

This letter is intended to provide information regarding the Kinship/Foster Care Emergency Fund and describe the allocation procedures for the use of those funds in FY 2001-02. <u>Counties that participated in last fiscal year's program</u> (FY 2000-01) by submitting their letter of intent, and were funded per the October 24, 2000, County Fiscal Letter (No. 00/01-32) <u>DO NOT NEED TO REAPPLY for this fiscal year's</u> <u>funding</u>. (See Attachment A for verification of County participation.) <u>If a participating</u> <u>county would like to terminate from the program, a letter of termination must be</u> <u>submitted</u> to the contact address listed below before August 10, 2001.

Counties that would like to participate in the FY 2001-02, Kinship/Foster Care Emergency Fund program and did not previously participate, need to submit a letter of intent by Friday, August 10, 2001. The letter must include a statement that agrees to establish a kin (relative) advisory committee to assist in determining funding needs, a description of the assistance that will be provided with the allocated funds, and an estimated number of caregivers who will be assisted. In addition, the letter of intent must include a statement of agreement that the county will report on the FY 2001-02 activities by August 1, 2002, (Attachment B) and the number of:

1) Children placed with relatives and prospective foster homes with the assistance of these funds;

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- 2) Existing relative placements maintained with the assistance of these funds; and
- 3) A brief listing of the three main reasons the Emergency Funds were used.

Funds are intended to assist relatives in providing care to relative children. Additionally, funds can assist prospective foster family home applicants in meeting the requirements to provide care to children. These funds may not be used to assist currently licensed foster family homes in meeting the requirements to continue to provide care to children.

Counties may use their Kinship/Foster Care Emergency Fund allocations to:

- Remove barriers (e.g., fire or water safety hazards, medicine storage, electrical repair or inadequate living space) that prevent a safe placement of a child;
- 2) Defray relocation expenses when necessary to ensure the child's safety or to provide adequate living space;
- Meet a child's special needs when those needs cannot be met through other funding sources (e.g., Specialized Care Incentives and Assistance Program (SCIAP);
- 4) Make emergency purchases of major appliances when necessary to serve the placement of children;
- 5) Defray utility installation fees;
- 6) Provide short-term crisis counseling to prevent entry or re-entry into the child welfare system; and
- 7) Provide temporary childcare to permit rearrangement of job or home schedules when an emergency placement is made.

All expenditures are on a one-time basis. Counties may serve relative caregivers and/or prospective foster parents requiring emergency services not covered by other sources, such as SCIAP or clothing allowances.

Counties must submit a Letter of Intent (<u>if they did not participate last FY</u>), an annual report of funded services (See Attachment B), or other information to:

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Contingent upon approval of the State Budget, funds will be allocated in August 2001, through the county allocation process. A total of \$1 million will be allocated as follows to participating counties with:

•	At least 500 or more children in relative placements	\$47,500
•	At least 100 but fewer than 500 children in relative placements	\$15,500
•	Less than 100 children in relative placements	\$5,000

This allocation structure is based on the counties' CWS/CMS placement data for the month of April 2001, (see Attachment A). Depending on the number of counties participating in the FY 2001-02 program, there may be a surplus of funds that will be additionally allocated to augment the funding level of each participating county. Claiming instructions for the approved counties will remain the same as in FY 2000-01 and will again be issued in the County Fiscal Letter that will also designate final funding levels for this fiscal year's allocation.
