SUBJECT: ADOPTIONS & SAFE FAMILIES ACT (ASFA) and AB 1695 PERIODIC INSPECTION AND EVALUATION OF APPROVED RELATIVE AND NON-RELATIVE EXTENDED FAMILY MEMBER HOMES

REFERENCE: ALL COUNTY LETTER (ACL) #01-85 ACL #02-58

The federal Department of Health and Human Services has expressed concerns about California's efforts to ensure that children in the child welfare services system are placed in safe, suitable, licensed/approved homes. In order to continue to claim Federal financial participation for approved homes, the homes must be periodically assessed to determine the continued appropriateness of the placement in compliance with State foster family home licensing/approval standards.

Current law (Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 309(d)) and regulation (California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 6, Chapter 9.5, Article 3, Caregiver Standards) require that counties periodically inspect and evaluate all approved homes for quality of care at least once per year, and as often as necessary, to ensure compliance with foster family home licensing/approval standards. When the periodic inspection and evaluation has been completed, a statement must be included in the case file or court report that the home continues to meet the approval standards.

Further, if a child in an approved relative or nonrelative extended family member home moves from that home to the approved home of another relative or nonrelative extended family member, the one-year cycle would begin from the date that the new home was approved.
