The purpose of this letter is to provide clarifying information regarding the treatment of income from the California State Work Study Program. The letter responds to questions received from counties and educational institutions on the subject.

The California Work Study Program is a state-funded financial program which offers college and university students the opportunity to earn income to help defray their educational cost, while gaining experience in educationally beneficial or career-related employment. Program participants are selected on the basis of financial need.

Earned income received by AFDC, RCA, ECA, or RDP recipients from the California Work Study Program is treated in accordance with MPP 44-111.25. MPP Section 44-111.25 provides that earned income from the College Work Study Program is exempt. This exemption is applied for both eligibility and grant determination whether or not the student has received aid previously, and is applied for graduate and undergraduate students.

For Food Stamp recipients, the California Work Study Program money, minus allowable exclusions per MPP Section 63-502.2(d), is treated as earned income in accordance with ACL 89-01. MPP Section 63-502.2(d) excludes this income only to the extent that it is usedu for tuition and mandatory school fees. (If specifically earmarkedu by the grantor for certain educational expenses such as travel oru books, that portion of the work study money so earmarked shall alsou be excluded in accordance with MPP 63-502.2(f)(1)(D).)u
